

Mission Possible: The Pavilion Project

Case Statement for the Bethany Birches Campaign to Rebuild the Pavilion (2012-2015)

Bethany Birches Camp grew from the compassionate vision of Lloyd and Alice Moyer for the many Vermont children. Bethany Mennonite Church and its pastor, Nevin Bender, joined the Moyers who gave 100 acres of land to make this dream a reality, starting in 1965.

By the 1970's, Bethany Birches Camp (BBC) consistently provided opportunity for young people to advance in their relationships with God in a natural and nurturing environment. A rustic facility, a unique program, and a community that believed in it came together in a way that touches many Vermont families, now sending a new generation of children, with younger siblings who can't wait for their turn to come.

Building on our history of successfully nurturing children and youth, and with the urgency of deteriorating facilities, we keep dreaming and **Stuff Campers Say:** God is great and He can take care of your worries.

planning about how to help young people grow towards God. With a history of creative thrift, we expect to foster this advance by filling up current programs and empty spaces in the schedule, as well as renovating existing buildings before adding new facilities. We also wish to do so sustainably—for staff, for volunteers, for the environment, and most importantly for the campers we serve.

With the future in mind, the camp's Board of Directors authorized a survey and interviews with camp families, volunteers, supporters and staff. The results of this effort made it clear that the camp and its supporters intend to move forward in ministry to children and youth for a long time to come. Because of this desire, renewing broken facilities is a must. A rainy day space in the summer, a better ability to get and stay warm so that youth are outside longer in the winter, and continuing the tradition of a rustic Pavilion as the center of Camp Life is especially supported. Here are some other key observations from the survey:

- Staff needs to be able to do their jobs with less stress due to insufficient space or antiquated equipment.
- Brandon and Amber Bergey bring solid leadership to BBC and people are willing to support (financially) the leadership they bring.
- Supporters of BBC understand that a lack of facility equates to program hindrance and fulfillment of the mission. They stand ready to help with some needed facility improvement.
- The Board is overwhelmingly supportive and ready to participate with its fund raising responsibility. And together with the Resource Development team has committed \$266,000!

Increasingly urgent next steps are required

To continue well in ministry to children and youth, BBC needs to:

- **Rebuild the pavilion**—creating more indoor space for use during inclement weather and making that space more weather resistant. Increasing program numbers call for more appropriate space, especially with regard to the kitchen, nurse quarters, camp store and storage.
- **Extend the program**—Campers come more than once per year. This distinctive is a key to how we impact young lives, and the more campers come to BBC, the better! We intend to increase the number of winter programs we run, as regulators allow.

The current facilities served us well even beyond their expiration date. Most recently, the state has taken notice by condemning the BBC cabin. The Camp must move forward in renewing itself for future service or risk not being able to serve altogether.

What's The Plan?

We seek to raise \$1.8 million dollars across the next three years.

- \$1 million will be raised quietly through private donors toward the new Pavilion.
- With \$1 million committed, an equivalent to \$400,000 will be raised publicly via volunteer labor and material donations in the barn raising of a new Pavilion.
- \$400,000 will be raised noisily, joyfully and immediately across the next three years to help children without means to attend camp (this is the normal subsidy we'd grant to campers over a three year period).
- Filling up our programs and filling out our schedule will further contribute toward this \$1.8 million dollar goal.
