I thank you for your ongoing support. What you have done this past year in making the Pavilion Project possible has been exceptional. As you will see in this report, the fundraising and hours given to the project are astounding. Perhaps a better word is miraculous. God has inspired many people to give, sacrifice and help to make the mission of replacing the original pavilion, possible. While the campaign goal of \$1,800,000 has been met (congratulations and thank you!) we have a little more to do. About \$350,000 more is needed to finish the project. Already, the new building has been a wonderful asset to camp programs and I trust will enhance and anchor additional efforts to accomplish our long term mission of helping young people develop their relationship with God. Our board of directors led by Phil Lapp and the campaign team chaired by Chad Yoder deserve special thanks for their hard work throughout this project. I am also thankful for the invaluable contributions of Phil Wilkerson (Construction Manager), Greg Jenne (Site Supervisor), Harold Bergey (Electrician) and Robert Buchan (Architect) who all made various sacrifices to see this project through.

2015 brought many challenges. I think each one strengthened us as an organization and the individuals within the organization. I am particularly excited about the challenge of replacing Amber, our 10-year program director. She did a wonderful job for so long. Dan Laubach was hired as Interim Program Director and before his term was up, I asked him to continue as the permanent Program Director. Amber has remained on staff in a part time capacity to help with his training and onboarding as well as administrative duties and volunteer coordination. She continues to be an asset to the camp and I am very excited about the way her and Dan are learning to work together. They both deserve a lot of credit for the way they are learning from each other. The camp is retaining valuable knowledge as a result of them forging an honest, good, working relationship.

The board has clarified that they want staff attention focused especially on marketing and camper program attendance. With Mission Possible: The Pavilion Project heading towards a conclusion and Dan settling into his role well, we are positioned to spend good time and energy on camper attendance. 




Additionally, we have renamed programs and grouped ages more specifically. We believe this will make it easier for parents to understand which programs are relevant to their child.



















10 Year Renter Day and Revenue Trend
